Dog Park Vision + Guiding Principles

Greater Buckhead is home to over 30,000 dogs. The Buckhead Collection proposes to address the recreational and social demands of dogs and their owners through a variety of facilities:

- Dog Waste Disposals | Clean-Up Facilities should be located in all Parks - Public
- Small Dog Parks | Runs should be located within 1/2 mile of every urban resident, either within neighborhood | community parks and civic spaces or at other locations
- Larger, Destination Dog Parks should be provided within 2 miles of every suburban resident, either within larger community parks or at other locations

Urban Dog Park | Run

- Occur in densley Population areas
- Can occupy underutilized spaces (i.e. alleys, park edges, large medians within urban parks or as sole-use sties
- Provides basic amenities including water fountain, waste stations, seating areas, fencing, shade | shelter, durable surfaces (typically not organic turf
- Fulfills basic needs including canine to can in en interaction, socialization, canine exercise, waste disposal





Destination Dog Park

- Occur in suburban or rural areas
- Can occur within larger parks
- Provides full range of amenities including water fountain, waste stations, seating areas, segregated recreation areas, shade structures, water | beach access, agility courses structures, trails | paths, larger exercise areas, restroom facilities, waste recycling, dedicated parking
- Provides a complete recreational experience including canine | canine interaction and socialization, canine/human recreation and interaction, larger size allows for increased flexibility and a greater variety of park programming. potential community event site, potential revenue generation




Small Dog Parks | Runs within 1/2 mile of Urban Residents
