## PARK(ing) Day COVID-19 Health Policy

The safety of our patrons and our staff is our number one priority. Our team continues to be in regular communication with local health and public safety officials and we intend to abide by relevant recommendations to ensure a safe and enjoyable event.

We are following the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance for large outdoor gatherings including, but not limited to:

- Implementing social distancing protocols which include:
  - Adjusting the size of the event to provide more physical spacing
  - Holding the event in a large, well-ventilated, outdoor space
- Providing sanitizing stations
- Encouraging mask usage
- Providing free masks for those without
- Creating a pedestrian traffic flow plan to avoid bottlenecks and to keep people moving
- Encouraging all food trucks to have touchless payment systems
- Posting signage to remind everyone of social distancing guidelines.

City of Atlanta Mayor Bottoms' executive order requiring masks is for indoors only, but masks are encouraged, especially for any unvaccinated individuals. Vaccinations are not mandatory for attendance but are encouraged.

As with any event during this pandemic, individuals need to evaluate their comfort level including their individual vaccination and general health status in deciding whether to attend. An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public space where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and guests with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable.

By attending PARK(ing) Day, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.
