

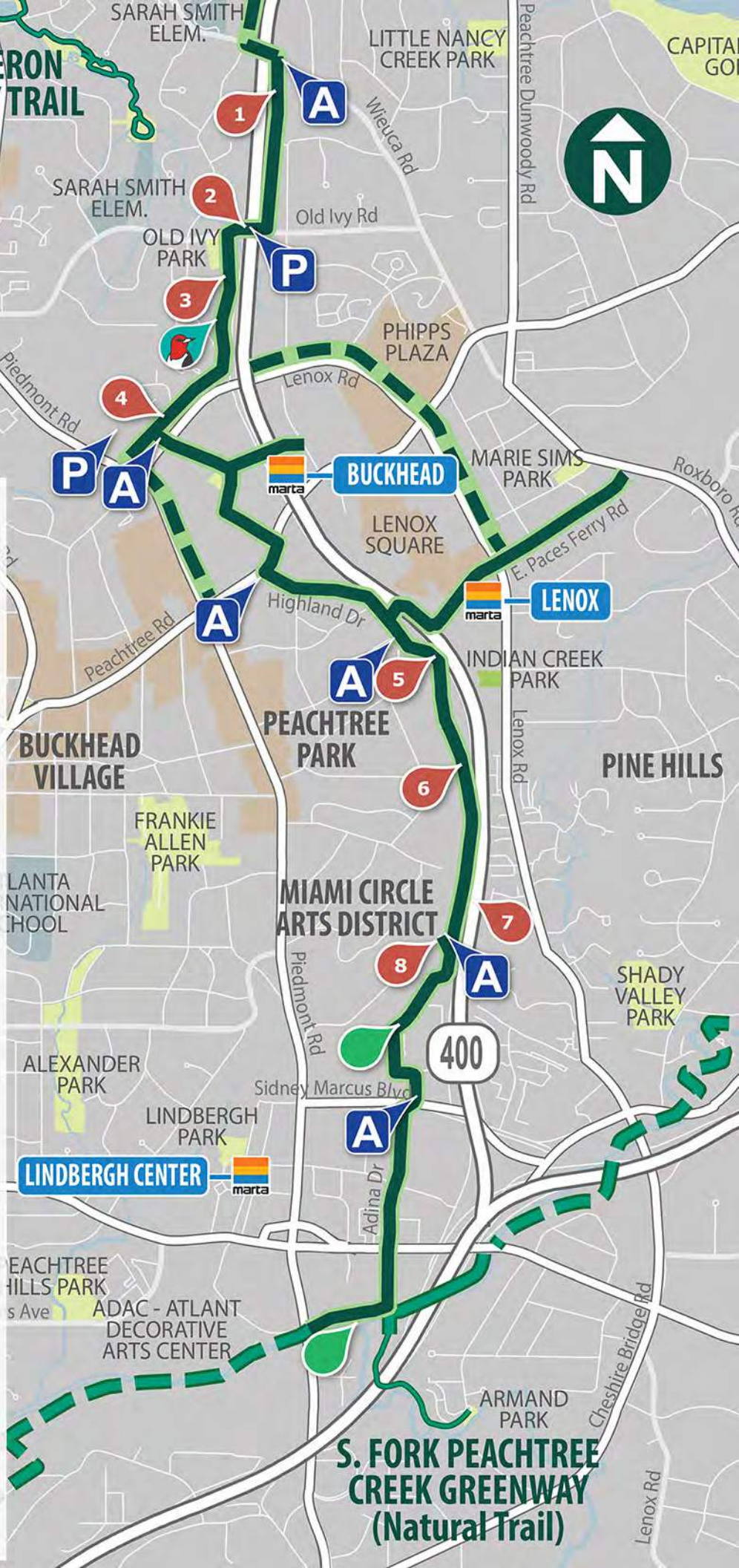

Art on PATH400

- 1** **Art Walls:** Five unique murals by Atlanta-based artists Angie Jerez, Lela Brunet, Angela Faustina, Aesek, & Nnekkaa
- 2** *Untitled*, by Deanna Sirlin: Color and light provide a backdrop to bike parking & fix-it station
- 3** *Playing with Shadows on PATH400:* Ten 6' tall steel & colored plexi panels designed by elementary school children
- 4** **Buckhead Wall:** You can't miss this oversized, sand-blasted wall announcing you're in Buckhead & on PATH400
- 5** *Untitled*, by Ashley Bella: A colorful, oversized mural in an unlikely place, with a powerful message
- 6** *Great Blue*, by Jonesy: A monumental-sized mural inspired by intricate patterns found in nature
- 7** *Untitled*, by Wallace Kelly & trail users: Structural columns for MARTA provide a canvas for the artist to draw outlines for these murals & members of the community to paint them
- 8** *Yarn Bomb*, by Willow Goldstein - The Bakery & the community: A fence separating the trail from traffic provides the backdrop for these on-going collaborative yarn creations

It is the centerpiece of a broader greenspace plan, the Buckhead Collection, and will increase access to community amenities such as arts, historic, and cultural exhibits; neighborhood pocket parks and greenspaces; retail centers; and learning centers.
